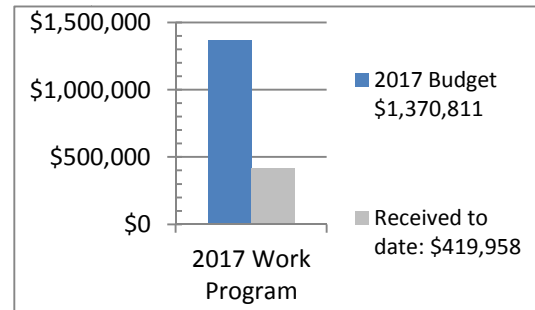
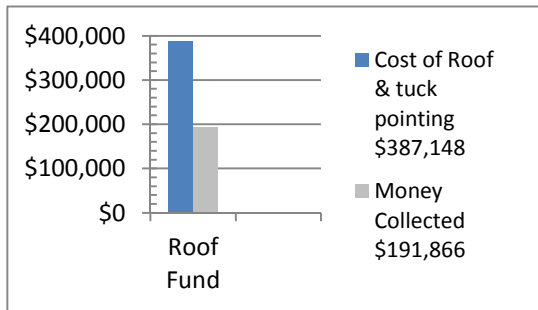

† Please turn off all cell phones and refrain from taking pictures during the service. Thank you.

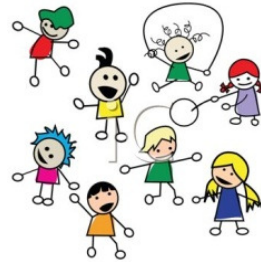

Learn By Heart: "Who receives the Sacrament worthily?" **LSB #327**

Next Sunday's Readings: Acts 1:12-26, 1 Peter 4:12-19; 5:6-11, John 17:1-11

SUNDAY SCHOOL STUDENTS: Today in Sunday School, we studied the account "David Becomes King." Just as David reigned over Israel, so the God-man, Jesus, our David, reigns over the kingdom of grace, of which we are citizens. Consider asking, "How was King David different from King Saul? How does Jesus serve as our King?"

Acts 17:16-31 ¹⁶Now while Paul was waiting for them at Athens, his spirit was provoked within him as he saw that the city was full of idols. ¹⁷So he reasoned in the synagogue with the Jews and the devout persons, and in the marketplace every day with those who happened to be there. ¹⁸Some of the Epicurean and Stoic philosophers also conversed with him. And some said, "What does this babbling wish to say?" Others said, "He seems to be a preacher of foreign divinities"—because he was preaching Jesus and the resurrection. ¹⁹And they took hold of him and brought him to the Areopagus, saying, "May we know what this new teaching is that you are presenting?" ²⁰For you bring some strange things to our ears. We wish to know therefore what these things mean." ²¹Now all the Athenians and the foreigners who lived there would spend their time in nothing except telling or hearing something new. ²²So Paul, standing in the midst of the Areopagus, said: "Men of Athens, I perceive that in every way you are very religious. ²³For as I passed along and observed the objects of your worship, I found also an altar with this inscription, 'To the unknown god.' What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. ²⁴The God who made the world and everything in it, being Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in temples made by man, ²⁵nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mankind life and breath and everything. ²⁶And he made from one man every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth, having determined allotted periods and the boundaries of their dwelling place, ²⁷that they should seek God, in the hope that they might feel their way toward him and find him. Yet he is actually not far from each one of us, ²⁸for "In him we live and move and have our being"; as even some of your own poets have said, "For we are indeed his offspring." ²⁹Being then God's offspring, we ought not to think that the divine being is like gold or silver or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of man. ³⁰The times of ignorance God overlooked, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent, ³¹because he has fixed a day on which he will judge the world in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed; and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead."

1 Peter 3:13-22 ¹³Now who is there to harm you if you are zealous for what is good? ¹⁴But even if you should suffer for righteousness' sake, you will be blessed. Have no fear of them, nor be troubled, ¹⁵but in your hearts regard Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; ¹⁶yet do it with gentleness and respect, having a good conscience, so that, when you are slandered, those who revile your good behavior in Christ may be put to shame. ¹⁷For it is better to suffer for doing good, if that should be God's will, than for doing evil. ¹⁸For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit, ¹⁹in which he went and proclaimed to the spirits in prison, ²⁰because they formerly did not obey, when God's patience waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was being prepared, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were brought safely through water. ²¹Baptism, which corresponds to this, now saves you, not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, ²²who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers having been subjected to him.

John 14:15-21 ¹⁵[Jesus said:] "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. ¹⁶And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever, ¹⁷even the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, for he dwells with you and will be in you. ¹⁸"I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. ¹⁹Yet a little while and the world will see me no more, but you will see me. Because I live, you also will live. ²⁰In that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you. ²¹Whoever has my commandments and keeps them, he it is who loves me. And he who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and manifest myself to him."

Treasures from the Church: "Therefore if the Church is to fulfill its task on earth, its mouth must be filled with the Gospel, and it must be diligent to open that mouth wide. It must not allow itself, through want of success, to set aside the preaching of the Gospel in order to pursue other means. What cannot be redeemed through the Gospel certainly cannot be redeemed. Would to dear God that He preserve our Synod so that we let it be our proper task to proclaim the Gospel near and far. Then, for our part, we will assist in gathering the scattered children of God and preparing them for the kingdom that has been prepared for them from the foundation of the world." F. Pfotenhauer in *At Home in the House of My Fathers*, 747.

Today's Reading: "*The God who . . . gives to all mankind life and breath and everything*" (Acts 17:24-25) wants all people to seek Him "*that they might feel their way toward him and find him*" (Acts 17:27). But in our sinful ignorance we humans turn instead to idols "*formed by the art and imagination of man*" (Acts 17:29). Therefore God appointed the Man of Righteousness, Jesus Christ, and "*has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead*" (Acts 17:31). Because He lives, we also live (John 14:19) in His forgiveness, and thus we love Him and keep His commandments (John 14:15). While the risen Lord prepares us for His Ascension, He will not leave us "*as orphans*" (John 14:18), but gives "*another Helper*," the Holy Spirit, to be with us forever (John 14:16) through the preaching of "*Jesus and the resurrection*" (Acts 17:18). Because He "*suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous*" (1 Peter 3:18), we "*regard Christ the Lord as holy*" and are always "*prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks*" for the reason for our hope (1 Peter 3:15). Our Baptism "*now saves*" us "*as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ*" (1 Peter 3:21).

The Divine Service: "How often we hear today that the church must change to meet the changing times. The true church will beware of such advice. For the needs of man have not changed since the Garden of Eden; nor has the cunning of Satan. And thus the church must ever guard against his deceptive advice. As our Lord once said even to Peter: 'Get behind me, Satan! You have not in mind the things of God, but the things of men' (Mt 16:23). In truth, the faith once delivered has not changed. The need for God's gifts in his means of grace has not changed. And the need for a stable worship life that points heavenward has not changed. The music of the church serves the needs of men, in the con-text of changing times, when it directs the hearts and minds of men to the unchanging things of God. In so doing, the music of the church - as with all the gifts of God to his church-preserves the church upon the rock of Christ, 'even when steeples are falling.' In the words of Pastor Johann Gerhard: "Beautiful as a lily is the church, but it is as a lily among thorns. She is the daughter of God, but she is greatly despised by the world and looks expectantly to her heavenly inheritance. She is as a chaste virgin and those who are true to her abstain from the embraces of the world. They belong to her and do not wish to dishonor themselves or her by an unholy alliance with the devil. Let her children beware that they not cling to Satan in an unholy union. Thanks be to God for his good gift of music! The true church delights and rejoices in the use of this gift as God intended, even as she surely will in heaven". - Kantor Richard Resch, *Music as Gift of God or tool of the Devil* Logia

Sermon: I don't know if there is a sadder thing to see in our world than an orphan - a child left without a father and mother to care for and to love him. Orphans aren't as visible in our country today as years ago, because we don't have institutions called "orphanages" anymore. But they're still around. Tornadoes and floods, car accidents, crime, the AIDS epidemic in Africa, all leave behind orphans. Yet perhaps saddest of all are the children who are orphaned simply because their parents didn't want them. You are no orphan! No, you are dearly loved by God our heavenly Father. Don't let the devil the world or your own sinful nature deceive you or mislead you into despair, but fill your ears with Jesus' Word, your mouths with His food, your hearts with His love, and your lives with His forgiveness. Truly He is coming to you and sending you His Spirit. You are no orphan. He is here, for you!
