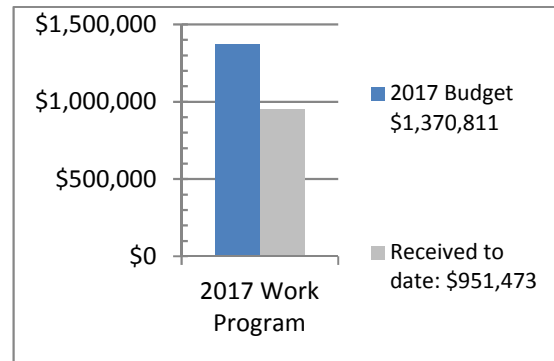
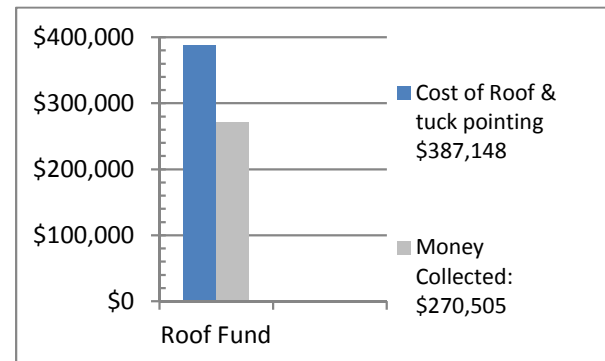

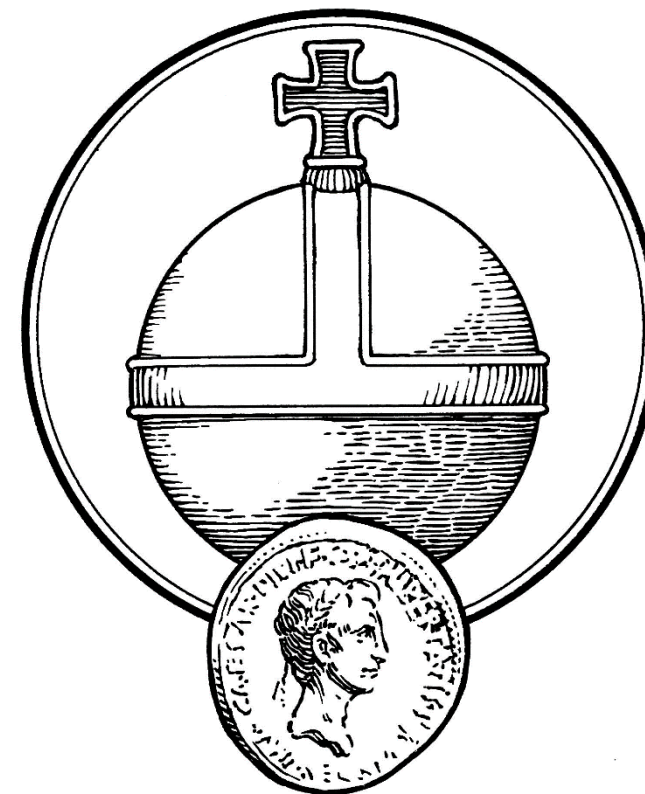

In Sunday School This Week: The Sunday School students study the story of "Hezekiah Prays" today. Hezekiah prayed in faith to God and was delivered. Jesus, our mediator and advocate with the Father, intercedes for us, granting us deliverance from sin, death, and the devil. Parents could ask, "Why did Hezekiah go to God in prayer? In what ways does God answer our prayers today?"



Notes on Today's Service

Isaiah 45:1-7 ¹Thus says the LORD to his anointed, to Cyrus, whose right hand I have grasped, to subdue nations before him and to loose the belts of kings, to open doors before him that gates may not be closed: ²"I will go before you and level the exalted places, I will break in pieces the doors of bronze and cut through the bars of iron, ³I will give you the treasures of darkness and the hoards in secret places, that you may know that it is I, the LORD, the God of Israel, who call you by your name. ⁴For the sake of my servant Jacob, and Israel my chosen, I call you by your name, I name you, though you do not know me. ⁵I am the LORD, and there is no other, besides me there is no God; I equip you, though you do not know me, ⁶that people may know, from the rising of the sun and from the west, that there is none besides me; I am the LORD, and there is no other. ⁷I form light and create darkness, I make well-being and create calamity, I am the LORD, who does all these things.

1 Thessalonians 1:1-10 ¹Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace. ²We give thanks to God always for all of you, constantly mentioning you in our prayers, ³remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁴For we know, brothers loved by God, that he has chosen you, ⁵because our gospel came to you not only in word, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction. You know what kind of men we proved to be among you for your sake. ⁶And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for you received the word in much affliction, with the joy of the Holy Spirit, ⁷so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. ⁸For not only has the word of the Lord sounded forth from you in Macedonia and Achaia, but your faith in God has gone forth everywhere, so that we need not say anything. ⁹For they themselves report concerning us the kind of reception we had among you, and how you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God, ¹⁰and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead, Jesus who delivers us from the wrath to come.

Matthew 22:15-22 ¹⁵Then the Pharisees went and plotted how to entangle [Jesus] in his talk. ¹⁶And they sent their disciples to him, along with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that you are true and teach the way of God truthfully, and you do not care about anyone's opinion, for you are not swayed by appearances. ¹⁷Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, or not?" ¹⁸But Jesus, aware of their malice, said, "Why put me to the test, you hypocrites? ¹⁹Show me the coin for the tax." And they brought him a denarius. ²⁰And Jesus said to them, "Whose likeness and inscription is this?" ²¹They said, "Caesar's." Then he said to them, "Therefore render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." ²²When they heard it, they marveled. And they left him and went away.

Treasures from the Church: "Political instability and social unrest are signals for Christians to increase intercession so that matters do not get out of hand. We can do more for international justice and world peace by our individual and corporate prayers than by anything else we ever do. Our prayers are our greatest contribution to the welfare of the world and the salvation of its people". - John Kleinig - *Grace Upon of Grace* CPH p.212.

Today's Reading: In the payment of taxes to Caesar (Matt. 22:15), the Lord pointed to coins required for the tax, and He answered that we should "*render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's*" (Matt. 22:21). But if coins bearing the image of Caesar should be rendered to him, then man — who is made in the image of God — must be rendered to the Lord. That tax is paid for us by the Lord Jesus, the image of God in the flesh, by His self-offering on the cross. And from His cross, as the Lord's anointed, He reigns as the true Caesar over all nations "*from the rising of the sun and from the west*" (Is. 45:6). The Lord once called and anointed Cyrus "*to subdue nations before him and to loose the belts of kings*" (Is. 45:1). Now by the preaching of the Gospel, "*in power and in the Holy Spirit*" (1 Thess. 1:5), foreigners from all over the world are "*turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God*" (1 Thess. 1:9-10).

The Divine Service: "As soldiers of Christ our whole life is dedicated to the resistance of the evil one. We resist the devil through our faithful attendance at the Divine Service. That is where Christ fights for us and equips us for the battle. Divine Service is His main base and our safe place of refuge. There He speaks His Holy Word to us and gives us His Holy Spirit. He also gives us His holy blood to cleanse and sanctify us. There He gets the devil off our backs and drives Him from our conscience. There we, too, engage in the battle by calling on His name and relying on Him for our deliverance. In the Divine Service we resist the devil corporately by praying for ourselves, the Church and the world. There we defy the devil by confessing our faith and singing songs of praise. So, it should not surprise us that he will do everything possible to stop us from going to Church and to sabotage our involvement in the Divine Service. We therefore resist him, most powerfully, is by drawing near to God. Every time we go to church to confess our sins, hear the Word of God, and receive Holy Communion, the devil loses another battle." - John Kleinig - *Grace Upon of Grace* CPH p. 266
