Vision Through Faith

Two years ago we, the members of Trinity, began what is known as "Vision Through Faith." This has been the theme of our effort to expand and remodel the facilities of our congregation and school in order to further the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ in this place. The focus up to this point has

been to pay for the loan on the purchase of the Trinity Lutheran Ministry Center and to remodel it to serve our congregation and school. Listed below are some of the highlights of the progress that has been made toward furthering the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ at Trinity via the Vision Through Faith effort:

+ Many members of Trinity have donated their time and talents to remodel the Trinity Lutheran Ministry Center and have cut the cost of this project by several hundred thousand dollars. If you would like to join them in completing this project, or, if you would like to take a tour of the Ministry Center, please call Jack VanDerWeele at 467-6813.

+ Many members of Trinity have pledged their financial support to make this vision of ministry at Trinity a reality.

+ Half of the first floor of the Ministry Center is finished and is being used by the Church Council, several Bible Study groups, the Youth Group, and several other groups for meetings. This has freed space at the church for more Bible studies. Also, we are considering using the Fellowship Hall as a lunch room for the school in the Fall so that the Gym can be used more for physical education. Currently tables have to be set up and taken down in the Gym in order to have a place for lunch. In addition, up to this point, the church lounge has been used for meetings and several school activities during the day due to a lack of space. The Trinity Lutheran Ministry Center solves this long-standing problem allowing us to use space more appropriately.

+ The walls of the second floor of the Ministry Center are up and are being prepared for painting. The second floor of the Ministry Center will be used for the school.

+ A \$50,000 challenge grant from the Siebert Foundation has been approved for Trinity, and, depending on how we, as a congregation, decide to use recent estate gifts, we are potentially within \$262,000 of the goal we need to reach in order to receive this grant as a gift. The deadline for reaching this goal is April 2008.

+ A Strategic Planning Committee has been formed and is seeking to capture the many voices of Trinity, and, like a choir, combine them to form a single voice of the congregation. A survey has been distributed to you to get your input so that our vision and mission statements are clear and concise to the end that everyone understands why we are here and what we need to do. At the heart of this process is the connection of the goals and actions of Trinity with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. If you have not filled out the survey, please do so now!

As you consider supporting Vision Through Faith by renewing or increasing your pledge or by pledging for the first time, I want you to think of Jack and Walter, faithful members of Trinity who recently passed through death and into the eternal glory of God. I am withholding their last names because I could just as easily use the names of other faithful members of Trinity through the years, like Frieda, or Elizabeth or Bob, etc. I still remember where Jack and Walter sat in church because they faithfully received the Gospel of Jesus Christ every Lord's Day. I witnessed how they cared for others in their lives. They both attended Trinity Lutheran School and one could see how it transformed their lives. At death, they each gave a monetary gift to Trinity that combined is in excess of \$500,000. They did not see the benefit of this in their own lives, but wanted the benefit to be seen in your lives as the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ is furthered at Trinity. We give thanks to God for them and for countless others who have gone before us at Trinity who, like Jack and Walter, were given a clear vision through faith concerning the love of God in Jesus Christ. May God grant us this same vision through faith!

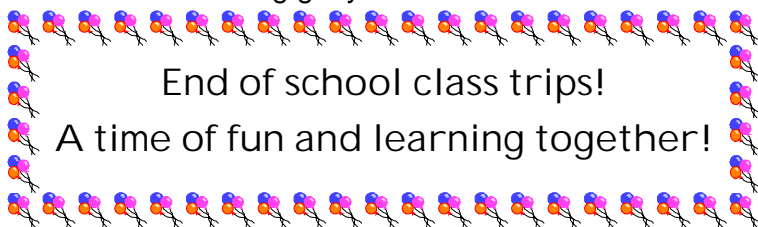

Trinity History



Much of the story of Trinity is contained in the minutes of the Voters' meetings of our congregation. The contents of these minutes are very interesting and offer an opportunity to learn of the colorful past of our beloved Trinity Church.



January 11, 1959 - Some long-range planning is to begin in the event the congregation intends to fit Trinity School into the now established 6-3-3 grading plan of the city public schools. Special committee appointed to study the plan and the feasibility of adapting our school to the plan by the addition of a 9th grade.

March 8, 1959 - A monetary gift is to be presented to Mr. Walter Kraatz, Sr. for his many years of faithful

service as Treasurer of the congregation. (This was presented at the May 13th meeting.)

July 15, 1959 - Addition expenditures of \$2400 have become necessary in renovation Grades 1 & 2 under the church but monies to cover this expense were donated by the Ladies Aid, Ladies Auxiliary and Couples Club.

November 11, 1959 - Christmas Eve services will include four services: German, Sunday School Children, Day School Children and Midnight Service.

A report on modernization of the organ was given stating work to be done during the summer of 1960 with a cost of \$10,450.

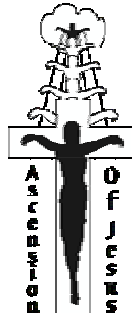
