From The Pastors



MAKING KNOWN THE LOVE OF CHRIST TO THE THEMBA TRUST

Dear Brothers and Sisters of our Lord Jesus Christ,



We need your help in Making Known the Love of Christ to the Themba Trust. All you need to do is buy a ticket for the Erin Bode concert January 24th at the Weill Center for the Performing Arts, Sheboygan, Wisconsin. Invite your friends and family of all ages! Tickets are available from the Weill Center ticket office and cost \$25.00 per ticket. All proceeds will go to the Themba Trust in South Africa through LCMS World Relief thanks to a generous donation from Thrivent Financial for Lutherans.

"Themba" means "hope" in the language of the Zulu, the predominant tribe in South Africa served by the Themba Trust. The roots of the nonprofit, faith-based organization can be traced to early mission work by German Lutherans more than 100 years ago. Today, the foundation operates girls and boys residential high schools and other academic and youth development programs that serve the rural poor in South Africa. Themba (pronounced TEM-bah) indeed brings hope to a country of great poverty and limited education opportunities and where HIV/AIDS turns children into orphans.

The "Themba Girls" who perform on the new CD with Erin Bode are recent graduates of the residential high school in Dirkiesdorf, a village southeast of Johannesburg and the Themba Trust headquarters. Bode and her band visited the school as part of a fund-raising project sponsored by LCMS World Relief and Human Care.

Since 1989, LCMS World Relief and Human Care have provided a number of grants for Themba ministries. Sinethemba High School for boys opened in the mid-1980s to provide education opportunities in a caring, Christian environment. Siyathemba High School for girls began in 1995. The two schools serve a total of about 500 students.



The Themba foundation also started a thriving preschool (which now operates independently) and provides facilities for a clinic that provides AIDS testing and counseling. Themba depends on charitable support to operate the schools and other youth and community development programs. At the girls' school, five students squeeze into a room about half the size of a typical U.S. dorm room. Bathrooms and showers are in a separate building. The foundation covers the boarding and tuition costs of about a third of the enrollment at both high schools. These students come from extremely poor families. Each year, Themba must raise at least \$300,000 to cover their boarding and tuition costs for needy students.

Because of the tragic impact of HIV/AIDS, Themba also provides for a growing number of "unexpected beneficiaries." When a student loses a parent to HIV/AIDS, the foundation arranges for financial assistance so the student can remain in school. Each year, about 10 percent of Themba's families struggle with payments due the death of a family "breadwinner." Proceeds from the new CD will be used by the Themba Trust for scholarships for needy students at both high schools. The foundation also wants to start a music center to offer students vocal and instrumental training.



Erin Bode's music career began as a child singing in church, so it's probably no big surprise that a new CD features her performing with a choir. But this time, Erin is a rising young recording star teaming up with a choir of young South Africans as part of a project of help and hope. Recording with the "Themba Girls" is the latest chapter for Erin Bode (pronounced BOH-dee), an acclaimed vocalist who has recorded two CDs, performs internationally and has opened for such artists as Michael Buble, Chris Botti and Jamie Cullum.



As the leading lady of the Erin Bode Group, the singer plays intimate clubs and national platforms. Last January, she performed with Garrison Keillor's "A Prairie Home Companion," staged at the Fox Theatre in St. Louis, Mo., and broadcast nationwide on National Public Radio.

Erin grew up in Wayzata, Minn., a suburb of Minneapolis, knowing that she wanted to perform. By age five, she was singing with the choir at Redeemer Lutheran Church, where her father, the Rev. Gerhard Bode, was pastor. The youngest of four siblings, Erin moved with her family to Missouri when her father became pastor of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Des Peres, a St. Louis suburb.

At Webster University, Erin pursued a double major in music and foreign language. She explored jazz, formed her own band and began building a loyal following. Musician Syd Rodway joined the group, and the couple married in 2004.

Erin has recorded four CDs. She penned the title song of her debut album, "Don't Take Your Time," with her pianist Adam Maness. Her second album, "Over and Over," also features originals as well as pop and jazz classics. Her latest CD is entitled, "The Little Garden."

Last Thanksgiving, Erin and the band recorded with the "Themba Girls," a South African girls school choir, in rural Dirkiesdorf as part of a project coordinated by LCMS World Relief and Human Care to raise scholarship support for needy students. LCMS World Relief and Human Care is the mercy arm of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS), the church body where Erin has deep roots. Her late grandfather, J.A.O. Preus, once was president of the LCMS, one of the United States' 10 largest Christian denominations. Like their father, Erin's brothers also are LCMS church workers: Gerry, an instructor at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis; Chris, a pastor in Buffalo, Minn. Sister Katie is a homemaker in Minnesota, married to Pastor Eric Nelson.



Since returning from South Africa, Erin's performances often include a mention of South Africa. "I would like to give people the opportunity to learn more and to get excited about how they can be a part of helping out," Erin says. 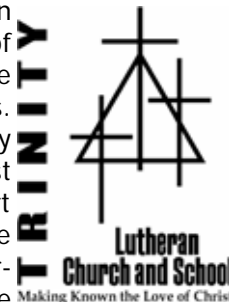

I have been very happy with the education the children are receiving. It is comforting to know they are at a place where they are loved."

Pat Eissner writes: "I would like to recommend Trinity to other families. Mary and I like the fact that the teachers at Trinity truly take an interest in each and every child. We feel like family at Trinity Lutheran School, not simply just parents of kids who go to the school. You asked about value? How is this for a story. We believe in the values that Trinity teaches about Christ-centered lives. Not too long ago I was sitting at my desk and looking at a picture of my parents, and a tear rolled down my cheek. Just at that time Heather came in the room and said, 'What's wrong, Papa?' I said, 'I miss my Mom and Dad.' Heather gave me a hug and said, 'It's okay, Papa, they're with Jesus and Jesus is with you.' I have told this story when I am asked, "Why do you send your kids to Trinity Lutheran School?" From the President



At the last voter's meeting, a question was asked about how to have your opinions and ideas heard at Trinity. We have many active people at Trinity, and people in place to coordinate work in the many areas of ministry. If you have questions, concerns, ideas or opinions please feel free to contact one of the pastors or any member of the Church Council. Following is a list of the different positions of responsibility, and a short summary of what those responsibilities cover. The people filling those roles are listed at the end of this newsletter.

President and vice-president. We would listen to any questions or concerns you have. We may not have an answer, but we would be able to point you to the person or board that could best handle what you need discussed. We work with all of the boards and areas of responsibility, and have an idea of what they are all working on. Please feel free to contact me with your questions.

Board of Elders. The board of elders is in charge of the spiritual life of Trinity. They work with the pastors and church staff. They are in charge of the church services, ushers, music, etc. Contact the elders if you have any questions or concerns about our church services, the music program, ushering. If you have a concern about any of the church staff, including the pastors, and need to discuss

this with someone, the elders would be the right people to talk to.

Board of Christian Day School. This board works with Trinity school. They supervise the activities of the school, including our kindergarten and extended care programs. They work with the principal. Contact this board if you have a question or concern about the school. If you have a concern with the principal or staff, you could talk to this board.

Christian education. This is the area that deals with all of the Christian education opportunities at Trinity. Things like Sunday school, Bible classes, Vacation Bible School, etc. Questions or concerns along these lines can go to the coordinator of Christian education.

Properties. This is the area that deals with the buildings and grounds of the Trinity campus. They keep the heat coming in winter, the water running, the roofs from leaking and the church and school cleaned. Questions or concerns (or volunteering) can be directed to the coordinator of Properties.

Evangelism. This is the area that looks to Make Known the Love of Christ to those people in our church, our community, and around the world. They are in charge of welcoming all of our new members. They look to spread the word about Trinity in our community. An example of this would be Trinity's presence in the last Holiday parade in Sheboygan. Any questions or concerns about Trinity's mission or evangelism go to the coordinator of Evangelism.

Human Care. This is the area that looks to meet the many needs of the people in our church, and our community. Emmaus meals at the Salvation Army, serving meals for Trinity funerals, Love Comes Down, Shut-in services, etc. are some of the things included in Human Care. Any ideas, questions or concerns along these lines can go to the Human Care coordinator.

Stewardship. This is the area that deals with the health of our church. They work to ensure that the members of Trinity are good stewards of all of the gifts that God had given us; financial, talents, time. Please contact our stewardship coordinator with your questions and concerns.

Youth. This is the area that works with Trinity's youth. They coordinate youth Bible studies, youth outings, the youth conference that will be held at Trinity again this year and many other aspects of keeping our youth actively involved in the church. Again, feel free to contact our youth coordinator with questions about this area.

Finance. This is the area that takes care of the finances of Trinity. They work to keep our budgets realistic, make sure people get paid, keep track of all the money coming in and going out, as well as all the money that sits in various accounts for special purposes. They are in charge of counting the money in the collection plates every Sunday, and making sure it all gets credited to the correct donors. Question about Trinity's finances can be directed to the Finance coordinator, or to our treasurer.

I did not list names for these positions. The names change, but the boards and areas of responsibility don't. The names associated with these areas is always listed in the church newsletter. Or you can call the church office, and the Chris will be able to give you a name to contact for any of these areas.

Be active in your church. If you have questions or concerns, make them known. If you have ideas or opinions to share, let us know. If you want to be involved in something, and haven't been asked, tell us.
