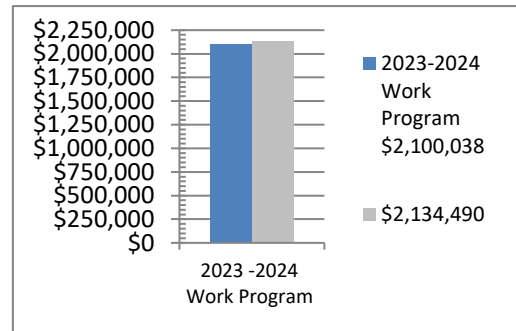

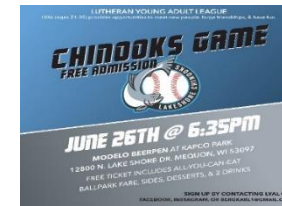


TODAY IS TRINITY GRADUATE RECOGNITION SUNDAY at our 8am service. Congratulations to all our graduates on your accomplishments!

Genesis 3:8-15 ⁸And they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. ⁹But the LORD God called to the man and said to him, "Where are you?" ¹⁰And he said, "I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked, and I hid myself." ¹¹He said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten of the tree of which I commanded you not to eat?" ¹²The man said, "The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit of the tree, and I ate." ¹³Then the LORD God said to the woman, "What is this that you have done?" The woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate."¹⁴The LORD God said to the serpent, "Because you have done this, cursed are you above all livestock and above all beasts of the field; on your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life. ¹⁵I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel."

2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1 ¹³Since we have the same spirit of faith according to what has been written, "I believed, and so I spoke," we also believe, and so we also speak, ¹⁴knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into his presence. ¹⁵For it is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God. ¹⁶So we do not lose heart. Though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day. ¹⁷For this slight momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, ¹⁸as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal. ¹⁹For we know that if the tent, which is our earthly home, is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

Mark 3:20-35 ²⁰Then [Jesus] went home, and the crowd gathered again, so that they could not even eat. ²¹And when his family heard it, they went out to seize him, for they were saying, "He is out of his mind."²²And the scribes who came down from Jerusalem were saying, "He is possessed by Beelzebul," and "by the prince of demons he casts out the demons."²³And he called them to him and said to them in parables, "How can Satan cast out Satan? ²⁴If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. ²⁵And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. ²⁶And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand, but is coming to an end. ²⁷But no one can enter a strong man's house and plunder his goods, unless he first binds the strong man. Then indeed he may plunder his house. ²⁸"Truly, I say to you, all sins will be forgiven the children of man, and whatever blasphemies they utter, ²⁹but whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit never has forgiveness but is guilty of an eternal sin"— ³⁰for they had said, "He has an unclean spirit."³¹And his mother and his brothers came, and standing outside they sent to him and called him. ³²And a crowd was sitting around him, and they said to him, "Your mother and your brothers are outside, seeking you."³³And he answered them, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" ³⁴And looking about at those who sat around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! ³⁵Whoever does the will of God, he is my brother and sister and mother."

Treasures from the Church: "Utter despair is to despair of self. Ultimate despair is to despair of God. In utter despair, we recognize our inability to save ourselves; we are brought to the recognition that the only place to look to for rescue is the Lord whose steadfast love and plenteous redemption are sufficient." - Rev. John Pless

Summary of Readings: The devil deceived us, enticing us to disregard and disobey the Word of God and driving us to hide "*from the presence of the LORD God.*" But the Lord, in His mercy, promised a Savior, who would set Himself against the devil on our behalf (Gen. 3:8-15). The Son of Man came, the incarnate Son of God, conceived and born of the woman. He "*first binds the strong man,*" Satan, by atoning for the sins of the world, thereby removing the condemnation of the Law and the fear of death (Mark 3:27). Now He plunders the devil's house by calling all men to repent. Though He appears to be "*out of his mind*" (Mark 3:21), He fulfills the will of God and makes of us His own brothers and sisters. Therefore, "*we do not lose heart,*" despite the suffering, sin, and death that we experience in this fallen world. "*He who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus.*" By His grace, we are "*being renewed day by day.*" For the Gospel is daily bringing us into His presence, not for punishment, but for "*an eternal weight of glory*" (2 Cor. 4:14-17).

From Depths of Woe I Cry to Thee: "Martin Luther's hymns were vitally important to the Reformation. They presented the gospel in beautiful, memorable ways that people could understand in their own language. One of Luther's earliest compositions was "From Depths of Woe I Cry to Thee," a paraphrase of Psalm 130 (LSB 607). He wrote this hymn in 1523, around the time that he was revising the Latin Mass. Near the end of the year Luther wrote a letter to George Spalatin, the court chaplain to Elector Frederick the Wise and encouraged Spalatin to compose German hymns based on the Psalms. He enclosed "From Depths of Woe" as an example. Little did Luther know that a few short years later in 1525 that same hymn would be sung at Elector Frederick's funeral. It was also sung at the funeral of Frederick's successor, Elector John the Steadfast, in 1532...The text of "From Depths of Woe I Cry to Thee" focuses on the sorrow we feel for our sins, and our hope in the forgiveness of Christ. It begins in the depths of despair that Luther himself felt as he was in agony over his sinfulness. The hymn continues by emphasizing that we can do nothing to earn God's forgiveness, but God's mercy towards us is a gift. The final stanza expresses trust that the grace of God is greater than our sins, and that He will redeem us in the end. The fourth stanza is my favorite, as it speaks of how we often have to wait for the Lord. Here Luther is reflecting on Psalm 130:5-6, 'I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I hope; my soul waits for the Lord more than watchmen for the morning, more than watchmen for the morning' (ESV). The hymn stanza reminds us that we wait in hope because we are God's children, and He will not forsake us." - Rev. Dr. Mark Birkholz

Sermon: "Out of the depths I cry to you," writes the psalmist. Trapped in the depths of sin and death, we become painfully aware that we cannot save ourselves. Yet when out of the depths of despair, we cry out to the Lord, our Father in heaven hears our cry. He, who sent Jesus into the depths of our sin and death, reaches down His hand in Christ to lift us up to new life with Him and each other.

What does “worship” really mean?

Most people use the word “worship” to mean something we do to honor God. Because of this misunderstanding, many people believe that a church service is what we do for God. The word “worship” comes from the root words “worth” and “ship.” These two words describe God rather than the ones praising Him. These words describe a God who is *worthy* of being honored and adored because of His love for us. God gives us His love through His Word and Sacraments. Worship is not something we do, but rather something that God does for us!

What makes the Divine Service so important?

The Divine Service is not about what we are doing for God, but who God is and what He does for us in the ways He has promised: His Word and Sacraments. That’s why Lutherans call it *Divine Service*. God is serving us! What a wonderful God we have!



Parents: The Divine Service is like listening to one long reading from the Bible. Everything in the Divine Service has been given to us through God’s Word. Explain this to your children, reminding them that it is God’s Word that delivers God’s salvation to us!
