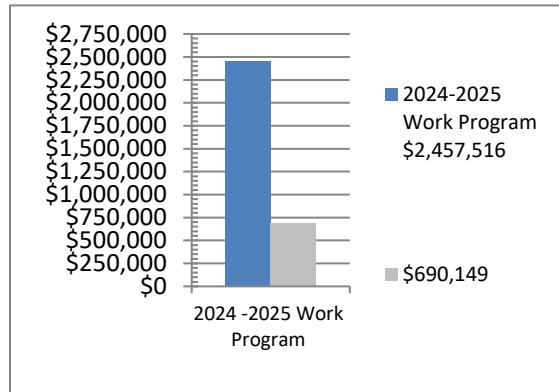

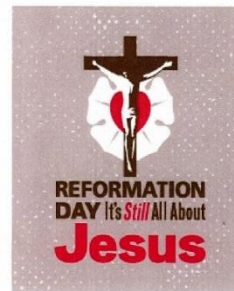

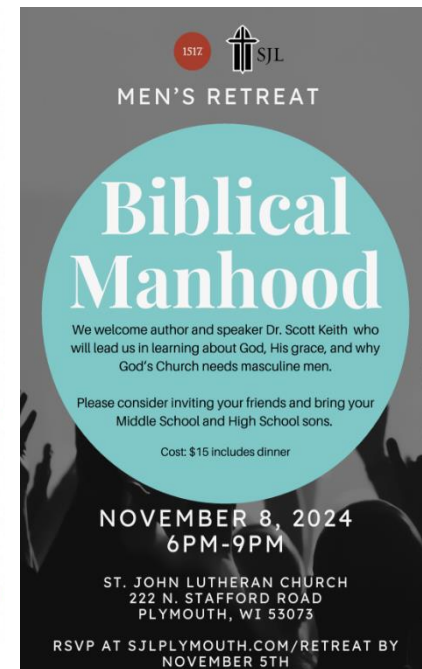

Learn by Heart: The Second Article (paragraph 3) (LSB p. 323)



**THIS WEEK IN SUNDAY SCHOOL:** This week's lesson is "A Walking Wonder." A man who had never been able to walk lies by the Beautiful Gate and begs Peter and John for alms. Having no gold or silver to give him, they offer him something better—complete healing. Leaping for joy, the man praises God for His miraculous healing, and Peter uses the opportunity to teach about the true Savior. The Jewish Council asks Peter and John by whose power they performed this miracle, so they witness concerning the power of the risen Christ. Being warned against speaking further concerning Jesus, Peter and John assert that they must continue to speak the Gospel



**Revelation 14:6-7**

<sup>6</sup>Then I saw another angel flying directly overhead, with an eternal gospel to proclaim to those who dwell on earth, to every nation and tribe and language and people. <sup>7</sup>And he said with a loud voice, "Fear God and give him glory, because the hour of his judgment has come, and worship him who made heaven and earth, the sea and the springs of water."

**Romans 3:19-28**

<sup>19</sup>Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. <sup>20</sup>For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin. <sup>21</sup>But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it— <sup>22</sup>the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: <sup>23</sup>for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, <sup>24</sup>and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, <sup>25</sup>whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. <sup>26</sup>It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus <sup>27</sup>Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith. <sup>28</sup>For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.

**John 8:31-36**

<sup>31</sup>So Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, <sup>32</sup>and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." <sup>33</sup>They answered him, "We are offspring of Abraham and have never been enslaved to anyone. How is it that you say, 'You will become free'?" <sup>34</sup>Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. <sup>35</sup>The slave does not remain in the house forever; the son remains forever. <sup>36</sup>So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed."

**Treasures from the Church:** "I am Lutheran for the same reason that I am a Christian. It is not by choice but by grace. The teachings of the Lutheran Church place Jesus at the center because the teachings of the Scriptures place Jesus at the center. No other confession demonstrates such fidelity to the truth of God's Word. No other confession so glorifies Christ by placing Him at the center of all it confesses and teaches. Being a Lutheran is truly all about Jesus. St. Peter says, 'There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved.'" (Acts 4:12) *Why I Am a Lutheran - Jesus at the Center* Dr. Daniel Preus Concordia Publishing House 2004

**Today's Reading:** "*Wisdom is justified by her deeds*" (Matt. 11:19), and the true Wisdom of God, Christ Jesus, the incarnate Son, has justified us by His deeds. He prepares His way by the preaching of repentance, but He has suffered the violence of the Law and voluntarily handed Himself over to violent men, that we might eat and drink with Him in His Kingdom and "*remain in the house forever*" (John 8:35). He is "*a friend of tax collectors and sinners*" (Matt. 11:18-19), and He has rescued us by His grace from the slavery of sin and death. By the proclamation of His eternal Gospel "*to those who dwell on earth, to every nation and tribe and language and people*" (Rev. 14:6), "*the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law*" (Rom. 3:21), "*that He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus*" (Rom. 3:26). And by the hearing of that Gospel of Christ Jesus, "*whom God put forward as a propitiation by His blood, to be received by faith*" (Rom. 3:25), "*you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free*" (John 8:31-32).

**Liturgy and Hymnody:** "When you stay away from church for no good reason, the bad reason is diminishing Jesus and intrusion of human factors. You are content with yourself and feel that you can manage another week without gathering in the name of Jesus and receiving forgiveness and strength from Him through Word and Sacrament. You can do without the church. You know jolly well you cannot, and if you allow for these intrusions, this pushing off Jesus, you are not in danger, you need some reformation. Do not give up your reformation, your membership in the church. That membership is powerfully expressed as you worship your way through the liturgy and hymns, which is a pattern of worship in which you join fellow members in the holy Christian church of many centuries and many places. This reaches a climax in Holy Communion when we acknowledge ourselves to be together with angels and archangels and all the company of heaven." Dr. Noman Nagel

**Sermon:** What makes you afraid? Perhaps you are afraid of the results of the upcoming elections. Perhaps you are afraid of an upcoming medical procedure. Perhaps you are afraid of where you will spend eternity. Perhaps you wonder if your sins are too great to enter into heaven. None of these need to make us afraid. Why not? Because we know that God is our fortress. We know that He is our strength. We know that we are justified by grace through faith in Jesus Christ apart from the works of the Law. God is by our side upon the plain with His good gifts and Spirit. If he keeps us safe from our own sin, from death, and from hell, how much more will he take care of us in this life and in the life to come? So, no matter what happens, we need not be afraid of the monster of uncertainty in our life! The Lord of hosts is with us! The God of Jacob is our fortress!

# URGENT NEED

### Hygiene Kit

- One hand towel (15 x 25 –17 x 27 inches)
- One washcloth
- One comb--must have at least 4-7 inches of teeth.
- One toenail or fingernail clipper
- Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger) Do not remove packaging
- One adult toothbrush --- Do not remove from packaging.
- Unopened toothpaste\*
- Hand sanitizer
- Small shampoo
- 10 adhesive bandages (¾ by 3 inches)
- One one-gallon size re-sealable bag

Place all assembled items into the one-gallon bag.

- \*Do not add toothpaste when assembling kits

### Flood clean-up kit

- One five-gallon round bucket with re-sealable lid (14.35” h x 12.19” w x 12.19” d)
  - No screw lids.
  - Buckets may be used but must be free from all residual product.
  - Advertisements on the outside acceptable
- One 32-64 oz. bottle liquid laundry detergent
- One 16-40 oz. bottle liquid concentrate household cleaner.
  - No spray cleaners
- One 16-34 oz. bottle dish soap
- One 4-8 oz. pump spray air freshener (liquid, not gel)
- One 6-14 oz. pump spray insect repellent (pack of 10-20 wipes is acceptable)
  - Pump spray bottles must have protective covers
- One scrub brush -- With or without handle
- 18 re-useable cleaning wipes
  - No terrycloth, microfiber or paper towels
  - Remove from packaging
- Five scouring pads
  - No stainless-steel pads with soap in them
  - Remove from packaging
- 36-50 clothespins
- One 50-100 ft. clothesline (cotton or plastic line)
- 24 roll of heavy-duty trash bags (33-45-gallon sizes)
  - Remove from packaging
- Five N95 particulate respirator dust masks (1-3 mm thickness)
  - No surgical masks
- Two pairs kitchen gloves
  - Durable for multiple uses
  - Remove from packaging
- One pair work gloves
  - Cotton with leather palm or all leather
