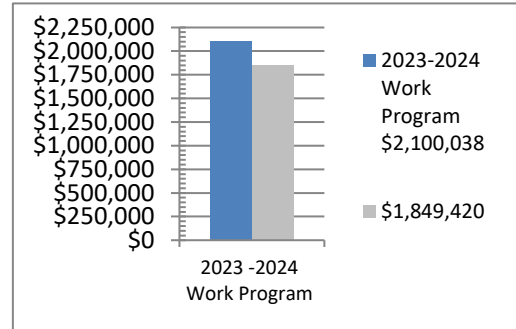

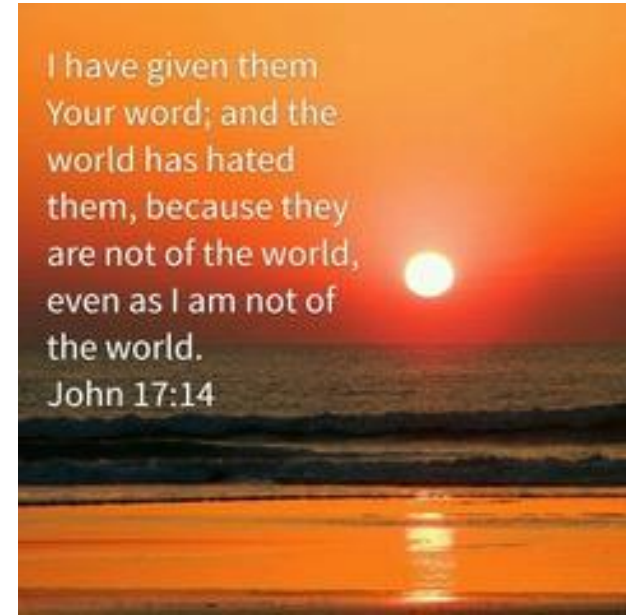

Today in Sunday School: This week, we study “The Passion Prediction.” In the week before His crucifixion, Jesus goes to dinner in Bethany, the hometown of Lazarus, whom He had just raised from the dead. Martha serves as Jesus and Lazarus recline at table. Meanwhile, Mary anoints Jesus’ feet with expensive ointment while wiping them with her hair, preparing Him for burial. When Judas voices his objections, Jesus tells him to leave her alone and points to His upcoming death.

Notes on Today's Service

Treasures from the Church: "You are included in this prayer of Jesus when he prays for 'those who will believe in me through their word.'" – Rev. Charles Henrickson

Summary of Readings: On the eve of His Passion, Christ Jesus intercedes for the disciples as their merciful and great High Priest. He prays that His Father would protect them *"from the evil one"* and preserve them in His name (John 17:11-12, 15). Along with His prayer, Christ Himself comes to the Father by His self-sacrifice upon the cross, thereby consecrating Himself for the sake of His disciples, *"that they also may be sanctified in truth"* (John 17:19). To that same end, He speaks to them in the world and gives them His Father's Word, that is, Himself. His apostles, in turn, have written these things *"to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life"* (1 John 5:13). For *"this life is in his Son,"* whom He has given by His Word, and *"whoever has the Son has life"* (1 John 5:11-12). By this apostolic testimony, disciples are gathered together *"with one accord,"* as one Body in Christ, *"devoting themselves to prayer"* and waiting upon the Lord in *"the upper room"* of His Church on earth (Acts 1:13-14).

Our Great High Priest: "The writer of the letter to the Hebrews teaches us about the role of Jesus as our liturgist, our great high priest. He says in 10:19-22: 'Therefore brothers (and sisters), since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), and since we have a great high priest over the house of God, let us approach (God the Father) with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled (clean) from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water.' Through Jesus, and together with him, we earthlings enter the heavenly sanctuary in the divine service. Because we have been cleansed from sin through baptism, we have unrestricted access to God the Father. The way into his presence is open before us. No Israelite ever had this kind of access to God in the tabernacle or at the temple in Jerusalem. There, once a year on the Day of Atonement, the high priest had restricted access to God's presence in the Holy of Holies. In the new covenant we all serve as priests together with Christ in the heavenly sanctuary. Together with him we have free access by faith to the Father's presence and his abundant grace. Our high priest Jesus bridges the gap between God and us. He brings God the Father to us just as he brings us to God the Father. There are two sides to his ongoing work as priest in the divine service. On the one hand, he speaks for God the Father and proclaims his word to us; through his word he brings the Father's grace and gives the Holy Spirit to us. Lutherans call this the sacramental side of the divine service; the eastern Orthodox tradition calls this the descending work of Christ. On the other hand, Jesus also represents us before God the Father and presents us together with himself to his heavenly Father; he leads us as we respond in faith to what God gives us and does for us in worship. Lutherans call this the sacrificial side of the divine service; the eastern Orthodox tradition calls it the ascending work Christ. The sacramental side of worship always comes first. It is foundational. The sacrificial side depends on it, just as you can only hear speech if someone speaks to you, and you can only receive gifts if something is given to you. We can speak to God only because God speaks to us; we can give only as we receive from God. – From *Access to God's Grace*, Dr. John W. Kleinig

Sermon: As Jesus is about to lay down His life on the cross for His friends, for His enemies, for you and me, and for all people, He prays...for all of us. What do you do when you're concerned for someone? You pray for them. Jesus prays, "Holy Father...I have given them your word." In this prayer Jesus is saying to us, "You have my word." To have Jesus' word is to have God's word. Jesus is saying, "You have my promise, God's promise, that I will do what He has said." Jesus gives us God's Word and promise, to do three things - three things that we need, namely, to keep us from the evil one, to sanctify us, and to make us one.

Acts 1:12-26 ¹²Then [the apostles] returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day's journey away. ¹³And when they had entered, they went up to the upper room, where they were staying, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot and Judas the son of James. ¹⁴All these with one accord were devoting themselves to prayer, together with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers. ¹⁵In those days Peter stood up among the brothers (the company of persons was in all about 120) and said, ¹⁶"Brothers, the Scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit spoke beforehand by the mouth of David concerning Judas, who became a guide to those who arrested Jesus. ¹⁷For he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry." ¹⁸(Now this man bought a field with the reward of his wickedness, and falling headlong he burst open in the middle and all his bowels gushed out. ¹⁹And it became known to all the inhabitants of Jerusalem, so that the field was called in their own language Akeldama, that is, Field of Blood.) ²⁰"For it is written in the Book of Psalms, "May his camp become desolate, and let there be no one to dwell in it"; and "Let another take his office." ²¹So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, ²²beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these men must become with us a witness to his resurrection." ²³And they put forward two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also called Justus, and Matthias. ²⁴And they prayed and said, "You, Lord, who know the hearts of all, show which one of these two you have chosen ²⁵to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place." ²⁶And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias, and he was numbered with the eleven apostles.

1 John 5:9-15 ⁹If we receive the testimony of men, the testimony of God is greater, for this is the testimony of God that he has borne concerning his Son. ¹⁰Whoever believes in the Son of God has the testimony in himself. Whoever does not believe God has made him a liar, because he has not believed in the testimony that God has borne concerning his Son. ¹¹And this is the testimony, that God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. ¹²Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. ¹³I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God that you may know that you have eternal life. ¹⁴And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us. ¹⁵And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him.

John 17:11b-19 ^{11b}[Jesus said:] "Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. ¹²While I was with them, I kept them in your name, which you have given me. I have guarded them, and not one of them has been lost except the son of destruction, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. ¹³But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves. ¹⁴I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁵I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. ¹⁶They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁷Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. ¹⁸As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. ¹⁹And for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth."
