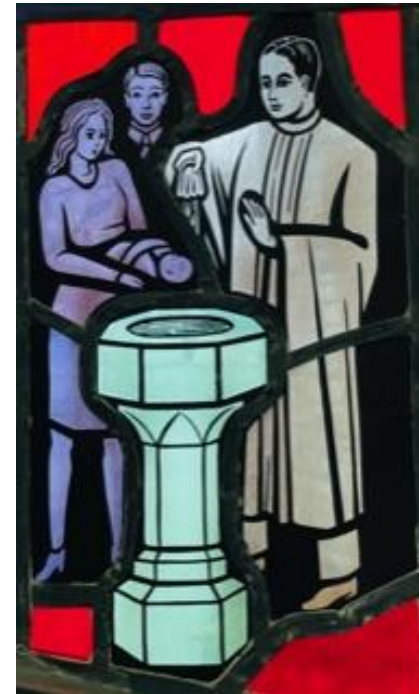
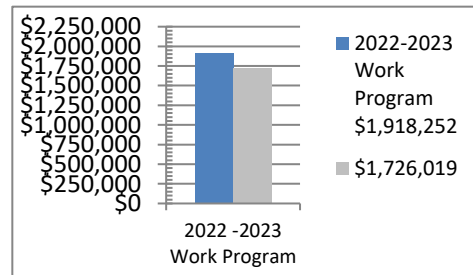
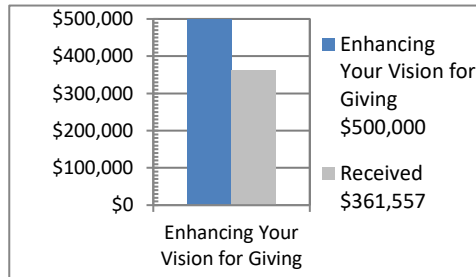

Notes on Today's Service

Numbers 11:24-30 ²⁴So Moses went out and told the people the words of the LORD. And he gathered seventy men of the elders of the people and placed them around the tent. ²⁵Then the LORD came down in the cloud and spoke to him, and took some of the Spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. And as soon as the Spirit rested on them, they prophesied. But they did not continue doing it. ²⁶Now two men remained in the camp, one named Eldad, and the other named Medad, and the Spirit rested on them. They were among those registered, but they had not gone out to the tent, and so they prophesied in the camp. ²⁷And a young man ran and told Moses, "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp." ²⁸And Joshua the son of Nun, the assistant of Moses from his youth, said, "My lord Moses, stop them." ²⁹But Moses said to him, "Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the LORD's people were prophets, that the LORD would put his Spirit on them!" ³⁰And Moses and the elders of Israel returned to the camp.

Acts 2:1-21 ¹When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. ²And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. ⁴And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance. ⁵Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. ⁶And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. ⁷And they were amazed and astonished, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? ⁹Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, ¹¹both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians—we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." ¹²And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" ¹³But others mocking said, "They are filled with new wine." ¹⁴But Peter, standing with the eleven, lifted up his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who dwell in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and give ear to my words. ¹⁵For these men are not drunk, as you suppose, since it is only the third hour of the day. ¹⁶But this is what was uttered through the prophet Joel: ¹⁷"And in the last days it shall be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit on all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams; ¹⁸even on my male servants and female servants in those days I will pour out my Spirit, and they shall prophesy. ¹⁹And I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and vapor of smoke; ²⁰the sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the day of the Lord comes, the great and magnificent day. ²¹And it shall come to pass that everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved."

John 7:37-39 ³⁷On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and cried out, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink. ³⁸Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.'" ³⁹Now this he said about the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were to receive, for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

Treasures from the Church: "Where Christ is, there is the Holy Spirit; where the Holy Spirit is, there is Christ. Christ and the Holy Spirit belong together." - Hermann Sasse

Summary of Readings: The Lord took "*some of the Spirit*" that was on Moses "*and put it on the seventy elders*" of Israel (Num. 11:25), and they "*prophesied in the camp*" (Num. 11:26). In the same way, our risen Lord Jesus poured out His Holy Spirit at the Feast of Pentecost — the 50th day and the "Eighth Sunday" of Easter. When "*a sound like a mighty rushing wind*" and "*tongues as of fire appeared*" and rested on each of the 12 apostles, "*they were all filled with the Holy Spirit*" and proclaimed "*the mighty works of God*" (Acts 2:2-4, 11). The Lord Jesus grants this same Spirit to His Church on earth to proclaim Him glorified on the cross and risen victorious from the grave for us sinners. From His open heart, our crucified and risen Lord pours out His Holy Spirit in "*rivers of living water*" (John 7:38) and invites everyone who thirsts to come to Him and drink freely (John 7:37). Through this life-giving work of the Holy Spirit, we hear our pastors "*telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God*" (Acts 2:11), and "*everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord shall be saved*" (Acts 2:21).

The Spirit in the Divine Service: "In the Invocation, the Spirit reminds us of our Baptism and assures us that He has drowned our old sinful selves and raised us to new life in Christ. In the rich Law and Gospel content of the Confession and Absolution, the readings and the sermon, the Spirit works through Scripture to create in us repentance and contrition, forgiveness, hope and faith in the resurrection of Jesus. As we confess our faith in the creeds and render our prayers and offerings to the Lord, the Holy Spirit magnifies our voices and our gifts, raises them up to our heavenly Father and adds His prayers to ours, making up for all we lack (Rom. 8:26-27). In the Lord's Supper, as we receive Christ's body and blood for the forgiveness of our sins, the Holy Spirit delivers to us 'pardon and peace' and strengthens us in 'faith toward [God] and in fervent love toward one another.' Throughout the Divine Service, we may feel peace or anxiety, joy or sadness, excitement, or boredom — or even all of the above! What we feel or don't feel, however, does not and cannot change the reality of what's happening. The Spirit is present among us, busily at work where He has promised to be: in the Word, in the Sacraments, wherever two or three are gathered in Christ's name (Matt. 18:20). By His grace, we leave the sanctuary resting in the peace of God, with His Word in our heads and His love in our hearts, equipped and ready to do the good works He has prepared for us." - *The Rev. Dr. Curtis P. Giese*

Sermon: A natural spring is found where water pressure causes a natural flow of groundwater onto the earth's surface. The water that Jesus speaks of comes to us by way of His Spirit at work through our Lord's words, and gives eternal life. The spiritual "rivers of living water" (John 7:38) from God flow down to us from the side of Jesus, who is at the right hand of God, and they spring up in the church. For where the Spirit is, there is Christ, and there is the church. In the bubbling waters of the font of Holy Baptism, the Spirit opened heaven to you and God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit made His home with you. It is why believers are channels of this living water to others. For Jesus, speaking of the Spirit said, "Whoever believes in me, as the Scriptures has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.'"

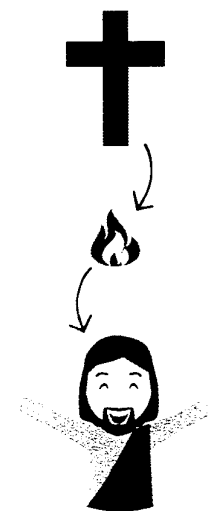

What is "Pentecost"?

The word "Pentecost" (pronounced PEN-tuh-kost) comes from the Greek word *pentekostos* which means "fiftieth." Exactly 50 days after Jesus rose from the dead, the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples in the form of flames of fire.



Why is Pentecost so important?

When Jesus died, the disciples were sad because they thought that their friend and Lord was gone forever. But Jesus rose again! Forty days after His resurrection, Jesus did finally ascend into heaven leaving the disciples below. However, before Jesus actually died, rose again and ascended into heaven, He made a promise to His disciples that He would send the Holy Spirit to them. He said that the Holy Spirit would come and guide them "into all the truth" (John 16:13). Jesus doesn't leave us alone to fend for ourselves. Jesus is here with us, and the Holy Spirit guides and leads the Church into the truth of the wonderful Gospel! We celebrate and remember this at Pentecost.

Parents:

At home, read the story of Pentecost in Acts 2 to your children. Remind them that the Holy Spirit comes to us through the Word and Sacraments just as our Lord has promised. Encourage them to thank God for the gift of His Holy Spirit in their lives.
