





Learn by Heart: Intro to the Lord's Prayer LSB p. 323



TODAY IN SUNDAY SCHOOL: In this week's lesson, "A Nativity Night," Mary and Joseph travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem, where a simple stable serves as the birthplace for the promised Christ Child. Angelic hosts announce the birth of the Savior to ordinary shepherds, who hasten to worship the child.

Having seen the Savior in the flesh, the shepherds quickly spread the news of His birth. Ask one another, "How can we share the message of the birth of the Savior today?"

Revelation 14:6-7

Then I saw another angel flying directly overhead, with an eternal gospel to proclaim to those who dwell on earth, to every nation and tribe and language and people. And he said with a loud voice, "Fear God and give him glory, because the hour of his judgment has come, and worship him who made heaven and earth, the sea and the springs of water."

Romans 3:19-28

Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin. But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus. Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith. For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.

John 8:31-36

³¹So Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, ³²and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." ³³They answered him, "We are offspring of Abraham and have never been enslaved to anyone. How is it that you say, 'You will become free'?" ³⁴Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. ³⁵The slave does not remain in the house forever; the son remains forever. ³⁶So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed."

STEWARDSHIP: Revelation 14:6 – "Then I saw another angel flying directly overhead, with an eternal gospel to proclaim to those who dwell on earth, to every nation and tribe and language and people." During the Reformation, this text was used to refer to Luther's ministry and the Lutheran message. We have an eternal Gospel to proclaim. Christ has freed us from our sins without any works on our part. We are saved by grace alone! And, ironically enough, Luther said this should make him the "apostle of works." Once we are freed by grace, we are truly free to serve God in works that flow from thankfulness and praise.

Notes on Today's Service


Treasures from the Church: "I am Lutheran for the same reason that I am a Christian. It is not by choice but by grace. The teachings of the Lutheran Church place Jesus at the center because the teachings of the Scriptures place Jesus at the center. No other confession shows such fidelity to the truth of God's Word. No other confession so glorifies Christ by placing Him at the center of all it confesses and teaches. Being a Lutheran is truly all about Jesus. St. Peter says, 'There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved.' (Acts 4:12) Why I Am a Lutheran –Jesus at the Center Dr. Daniel Preus Concordia Publishing House 2004

Today's Reading: "Wisdom is justified by her deeds" (Matt. 11:19), and the true Wisdom of God, Christ Jesus, the incarnate Son, has justified us by His deeds. He prepares His way by the preaching of repentance, but He has suffered the violence of the Law and voluntarily handed Himself over to violent men, that we might eat and drink with Him in His Kingdom and "remain in the house forever" (John 8:35). He is "a friend of tax collectors and sinners" (Matt. 11:18–19), and He has rescued us by His grace from the slavery of sin and death. By the proclamation of His eternal Gospel "to those who dwell on earth, to every nation and tribe and language and people" (Rev. 14:6), "the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law" (Rom. 3:21), "that He might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus" (Rom. 3:26). And by the hearing of that Gospel of Christ Jesus, "whom God put forward as a propitiation by His blood, to be received by faith" (Rom. 3:25), "you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free" John 8:31–32).

Liturgy and Hymnody: "When you stay away from church for no good reason, the bad reason is diminishing Jesus and intrusion of human factors. You are content with yourself and feel that you can manage another week without gathering in the name of Jesus and receiving forgiveness and strength from Him through Word and Sacrament. You can do without the church. You know jolly well you cannot, and if you allow for these intrusions, this pushing off of Jesus, you are not in danger, you need some reformation. Do not give up your reformation, your membership in the church. That membership is powerfully expressed as you worship your way through the liturgy and hymns, which is a pattern of worship in which you join fellow members in the holy Christian church of many centuries and many places. This reaches a climax in Holy Communion when we acknowledge ourselves to be together with angels and archangels and all the company of heaven." Dr. Noman Nagel

Sermon: Fear surrounds our lives—wars, disasters, political turmoil, sickness, loss. Yet the worst fear of all is not knowing God, for without Him, every other fear is absolute. Psalm 46 reminds us that even when the earth gives way, "God is our refuge and strength." Martin Luther understood fear. He once trembled before God's judgment, trying desperately to earn His favor. But when the Gospel of Romans 3 opened his eyes— "all have sinned... and are justified by His grace as a gift"—his terror turned to faith. The God who could condemn instead gives Himself to save. This is the heart of the Reformation: God does not just give blessings: He gives Himself—Christ crucified and risen for us. Through Word and Sacrament, this same Christ gives Himself still. In Baptism He claims us. In Absolution He forgives us. In the Lord's Supper, He feeds us with His own Body and Blood. Here, in the Divine Service, God serves His people, freeing us from fear and filling us with His peace. The angel's message in Revelation 14— "Fear God and give Him glory"—is not a threat but comfort. It proclaims the fall of Satan and the victory of the Lamb. The highest worship of God is to receive His gifts with faith and thanksgiving. Luther's hymn A Mighty Fortress Is Our God confesses this truth: the devil rages, the world trembles, but Christ's Word stands firm, Because Jesus has conquered death, we are free—free to live without fear. So, when the world shakes, when judgment seems near, you can say with confidence: The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress. No fear. Just faith. Just Jesus.
